THE CHICHESTER STAMP & DISTRICT PHILATELIC SOCIETY.

The second competition evening for The Chichester & amp; District Philatelic Society was held on Monday evening, 25th September. A fine turnout of members and a great many entries were the order of the evening.

The Peal (Novices Cup) was won by Neil Smith with his display about French engraver Albert Marius Hippolyte Descaris, a name that my spellcheck wishes to alter! Descaris was a gifted French engraver of stamps, with his definitive issues of Gallic cocks of 1962 being some of the most beautiful. Descaris began engraving in 1935 and continued until his death in 1985.

Second place in the Peal Cup was Frank Griffiths with his excellent layout and display design entitled ' Private Ship Letter Stamps of the Caribbean'.

Third was John Armstone with 'Sussex Cinderella's', fourth, Christopher Dudeney's 'Charles Augustus Lindbergh' with " all new material", and fifth, Russell Hill's display entitled 'Where's Chichester ', with a display of covers showing cancellations of Chichester.

The Allan Postal History Cup was a Joint First place between Martha Brown and Christopher Podger.

Martha Brown displayed the numerous cancellations on cover about 'Third Reich National Stamp Collecting Day' that was a regular feature in Germany in 1930s-1944.

Christopher Podger 's display of ' Cyprus Incoming Postal Stationery', with its excellent design and numerous cancellation features was also another display of history Postmarks tell a story of how the mail moved from place to place, or about people in different countries at different historical times. Through cancellations and postal markings a story emerges about the transit of letters and postal cards. Any letters included in these add to the tale! This is the essence of Postal History.

Third place was Frank Griffiths 'Virgin Islands', fourth, Russell Hill 'Chichester to Selsey Tramway', fifth, John Armstone 'D-Day & amp; the Post Office', and sixth place was Christopher Dudeney 'Ryde IOW Postmarks'. As one can see, there was quite a mixture of themes in the postal history displays for the Allan Postal History Cup.

The Birkin Modern Trophy was won by Heather Lawn with a colourful and artistically designed display entitled 'Aitutaki in the Cook Islands'. This tiny island in the South Pacific measures only 18.3 square kilometres! Heather Lawn collects thematically, and her birds of Aitutaki , including White Tern,

US POSTAL CARD'S USED IN CHICHESTER

There are several types of postal stationary with the most common being stamped envelopes and postal cards with an imprinted stamp or indicia (markings on a mail piece showing that postage has been prepaid by the sender). The first form of postal stationary was created by the United Kingdom around 1841. Other countries quickly followed including the United States of America. The postal cards below are both being sent to Mr Henry Chapman, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, USA. The Chichester postmark is from a town called Chichester in Merrimack County, New Hampshire, USA. This settlement in the US was established in 1727 by Thomas Pelham-Holles, Earl of Chichester, West Sussex, UK and was named after him, hence the town being called Chichester.

United States Postal Card dated the 21st January 1927 US postage prepaid 2 cents with Chichester NY circular datestamp Jan 21, A.M, 1927

Mr. Henry Chaque United States Postal Card dated 28th January 1931 US postage prepaid 2 cents with Chichester NY circular datestamp Jan 28, P.M, 1931

Pacific Golden Plover, or Pomarine Jaeger were beautiful examples of bird life on this island. It was a Lovely display meriting the award of first place.

Christopher Dudeney showed 'Turkish Cyprus Posts' for second place. Quite a lot of history demonstrated through the numerous cancellations and markings.

Equal Third place in the Birkin Modern were Martha Brown , with colourful USA Federal Duck Stamps , and Russell Hill " A New Millennium" with a post year 2000 display.

Fifth and sixth places in the Birkin Modern

were Christopher Podger with his colourful display of 'Turkish Cyprus Revenue Stamps', and John Armstone's cheery 'Christmas Charity Posts'.

Well done to all members who displayed and competed, and to all members for such a great attendance on the night.

Meeting 11th September, 2023.

'8 in 3' GB and/or The Channel Islands - Members + Auction.

The Membership enjoyed 5 interesting displays, covering a variety of subjects. Hugh Jefferies was first in to bat with his well researched presentation entitled 'Stamped to Order – Postal Stationery'. Tracing its chronology, Hugh began with the well known 'Mulready'. This quickly proved unpopular within Victorian Britain, and was soon replaced by new envelopes having the embossed Queen's head. Organisations were able to have their own company address printed on these envelopes, a practice that was attractive in commercial terms. The display featured covers from Edward VII's reign. Various rates were available and these could be assisted by adhesives as needed.

Alan King presented his display - 'Surface Printed GB', 1851-1880'. This contained stamps and covers, a fascinating collection developed during Lockdown. Beginning with the 4d. Carmine, and then highlighting the 6d.value, Alan progressed to skilfully consider watermarks/errors, shades, papers and plates, and presented here, but a fraction of his collection. The 9d. Straw was well represented, with the 10d being included. The 1/- Green was also promoted, but scarce forgeries were not present, some being far more valuable than the legitimate! Concluding with the 2/- Blue value, he regretted not possessing the rare 2/-Brown!! (a crowd funding might assist!!)

Michael Goodman provided a short display, a study extract from a recent competition entitled 'The Machin Head, the final years'. This considered 'Post and Go', which had its origins in 2008. This service enabled customers to print out their own labels! Those depicted are the basic set from a presentation pack and show the office identifier number. (different!) 'The 1d Black and the First 1d Red' display provided early interest. Here Julian White had made a close study and shared a number of covers. The '8 in 3' part of the evening, prior to the monthly auction, concluded with Rod Greer's examination of 'KRAC Machins in NI'. These were well demonstrated though a variety of covers, with one depicting an early (1941) Armagh cancel.

Meeting 12th September, 2023,

Members' Displays Using the Letter 'A' + Bring & Buy'.

This very well attended meeting saw 9 worthy displays, which together with a huge 'Bring & Buy' session, certainly secured an excellent evening, the first in the autumn calendar. The subjects were far ranging. Gordon Masson's 'Locomotives' was the first presentation and comprised 15 sheets. This focussed on old railway engines which were promoted by mainly first day covers and postcards. Under the neat title 'Art in the Age of Steam-in Philately', the display depicted railway steam engines dating from 1830, right through to the present.

'Australian Antarctic Territory' was displayed by Keith Clements. Using album pages which covered both this territory and relevant GB issues, the subject provided a colourful emphasis on 'global warming' and 'wild life', 'scientific' and 'trading supply shipping'. A strong collecting interest was evident in Clarewyn Smitt's long term amassing of - 'Interesting Postmarks' (from numerous philatelic administrations). This was a fascinating study of medical themed cancels, many being of health-slogan or recruitment advertising intent, Michael Goodman considered 'A is for Advertised' through a series of covers. This display looked at the Post Office's practice of advertising, to find addressees. (Unclaimed Mail) RPS welcomed new member Rob Hibbitt's personal contribution of 'A New Zealand Conception'. This featured 'Operation Deep-freeze' - a code name for US missions to Antarctia with a superb airmail bearing a 1978 'Polar Star' cancel. 'Additional' was David Etchells' early study which revealed his finding of a cover with a half-penny 'Wheel Tax' handstamp...a tax levied in Scotland. (1813-1839) 'Anhingas -a snapshot of a colonial past' was a beautifully written-up display, compiled by Simon Casalis de Pury. This looked at French Equatorial Africa stamp issues - 1936 (first issue) and 1958 (final). The concluding presenter,

Paul Barry, shared his origins of collecting interest in Southern Rhodesian issues, whereby a large box containing an African drum, stuffed with numerous stamps had been posted to him when aged 12, from his godfather, a keen philatelist, based in its capital, Salisbury...magic!! Entitled 'Acquisitions', it well rounded off the 'A is for...' themed evening, to be followed by a major 'Bring & Buy' session, being made possible by a most generous local donor, via Gordon Masson, the RPS secretary.

THE CHICHESTER STAMP & DISTRICT PHILATELIC SOCIETY. 23rd October 2023.

The Chichester & amp; District Philatelic Society were very privileged to host Mr Peter Davidson, Secretary of the Portsmouth & amp; District Philatelic Society on Monday 23rd October. His presentation, entitled "The Evolution of



Steam" was an education in rail gauges, curves, iron used in rail construction and locomotive history.

Who wouldn't be intrigued by the history of Richard Trevithick who is 1801 began construction of a stationary steam boiler. He continued with his inventions and in 1804 he invented the world first steam locomotive for the Merthyr Tramroad in South Wales. In 4 hours and five minutes it travelled 15,69 km

(9.75mi) with a speed of 5 mph! In 1811 John Blenkinsopp patented a design for a locomotive for the Middleton Railway. Other inventors and engineers were mentioned, but the father and son team known to most schoolchildren were George and Robert Stephenson whom in 1813 built them 'Puffing Billy', followed in 1814by the 'Blucher'. As Mr Davisons is quoted, things were "getting bigger and better". His presentation was backed up with numerous picture post cards, special commemorative covers with fancy cancellations and intricate cachets, and stamps from Great Britain, Nevis, Funafuti-Tuvalu, Guyana, Nevis and more. His second half included discussion about steam locomotion and engines through to the 1960s.

Meeting 14th November, 2023.

Speaker: Mike Smith FRPSL 'ORANGE FREE STATE'

This was truly an exploration into a little known area of philatelic study. Society Members had within their reach an introduction to, as the Chairman said: 'A huge, deep study of much complexity; rare, superb quality.. exceptional write up'.

Mike Smith, besides his 'Royal' status, has many crowning glories. He is an International Judge, an authority on Postal Stationery, Secretary of the Federation of International Philatelists' Philatelic Society Commission (with 4 Large Gold Medals) and recently returned from Essen in Germany, having presented at the Seminar: 'Current Trends in Postal Stationery'. (May, 2023) Setting the Orange Free State in context, Mike explained that the State principally benefited from its agricultural and mining activities. Mike skilfully traced its postal history in some depth. First administered by GB, this tiny country found itself at the centre of international affairs, being a major focus of the Boer War. (1899) It was inevitable that a chequered philatelic path was to evolve. A complex web of official stationery card printings, (De Ia Rue) with some locally produced, was to ensue, with many observed within the display. The presentation was far ranging, covering stamp and card production, including overprints (Bloefontaine), and rarities.



The accompanying photographs provide a flavour of the specialisation which this presentation revealed. Mike made good use of anecdotes which included insights into how his collection was formed. Amongst the fascinating points made was that on asking dealers to reveal their stock of 'Orange Free State' items, frequently bargains could be obtained, since this was a largely unstudied area of philately, and their lack of knowledge could be to his advantage!! Perhaps with more recent publicity, it is harder to strike such bargains from dealer stock books!!

A wonderful presentation of philatelic material, being of clearly international status.



FERNDOWN & WEST MOORS PHILATELIC & POSTCARD CLUB.

Meeting 27th November, 2023. Speaker Wendy Buckle FRPSL - '6000 Years of Writing Materials'.

Members were certainly well entertained to a highly specialised feast, underpinned by huge research and guality presentation and by philatelic study and inclusion. Speaker and Club Member, Wendy Buckle FRPSL described her amazing resource as 'a light hearted look at various cultures in their use of writing materials, of which 21 different materials are shown'. Under the title 'Animal, Vegetable and Mineral', the scope of this superb presentation was extensive. Touching first on the familiar, Wendy identified the Egyptian and Roman use of stone as a writing material, seen for example, in memorials and tombstones. Metal was considered, being a material used by rich rulers to impress. There was the example of metal (aluminium) postcards, not Post Office friendly, until receiving rounded edges and envelope covering! Moving on to wood, this material, widely used in Scandinavia and Russia, was followed by the use of cork, being a product of Portugal and Spain. Birch bark from Sweden was also featured within the display. The Chinese made much use of the mulberry tree to manufacture paper, as was their widespread use of bamboo, both as a writing material and for paper. From the Far East, there was the use of palm leaves, with, from Egypt, the widespread use of papyrus was seen, which will last for hundreds of years in the right conditions. The silver tree, from Table Mountain, was well used, particularly in Edwardian times, almost to extinction. Of great rarity was observed the Mutton Bird shrub's paper manufacture from New Zealand. Peat and flax from Ireland were featured. Cotton was used originally in paper manufacture, a product particularly appreciated by artists in search of quality. Wendy provided sheets devoted to the use of bone, leather, vellum, parchment and silk, where her embroidered cards were quite exquisite. Paper was highlighted as a front runner, emerging as a worldwide product attracting governmental taxation! Following much inspection and debate in the interval. Wendy then provided a most interesting study of John Dickenson's emerging 19th century paper empire. This section made good use of stamps, covers, cards, photos and advertising examples, plus 3D items including lovely models of a railway wagon and commercial van. The development of Dickinson's company was well covered, looking at the early 1800's with the machine made paper manufacture. The development of the Mulready and 1d and 2d postal stationery items were highlighted, but his inability to secure the Penny Black/ Twopenny Blue contracts was noted. (monopoly issue) The emergence of Dickinson's security papers featured, being of particular importance during the two World War periods. Further company products were considered.

An interesting section focussed on Rowland Hill's huge postal innovations. Vice Chairman Terry Kirkman, praised the sheer quality of research and materials displayed and voiced the appreciation of all. He then presented Wendy with the Club's Certificate and Engraved Glass Tumbler.

A great story from a great collector.

'A great story from a great collector' was how Chris Harman RDP, Hon FRPSL, giving the Vote of Thanks, described the display and presentation by Howard Hughes FRPSL to the members of the Royal Philatelic Society London on 9 November 2023. Titled 'The Maltese Cross', the display provides the background to the Maltese Cross obliterator, introduced by the Post Office in May 1840 to prevent the fraudulent re-use of the newly introduced postage stamps and postal stationery.

The display won the Grand Prix National when shown at the London 2022 International Stamp Exhibition. It explains how the obliterator was used – including the need to change the ink composition and design of the obliterator – and why and when it was replaced, including examples of late usage. Introducing his presentation, Howard explained how studying the Maltese Cross has become 'a lifelong passion' as, when he began the collection, the information was not known, and he had to undertake the research. The result, as Chris Harman commented, is 'a watershed collection' full of extraordinary material. President of the Royal Philatelic Society London, Michael Roberts FRPSL, presented Howard with the Society's plaquette and certificate.

PRESS RELEASE.

A chance buy of a bundle of covers at an auction led Julian Tweed to discover the fascination of Great Britain Express Mail. Julian shared his passion, the result of years of research and discovery, with members of the Royal Philatelic Society London at a display and presentation given on 26 January.

The express delivery service was introduced by the British Post Office on 25 March 1891 and over the years was effected in different ways, from the use of telegraph boys who carried the letter for its entire journey, messages sent initially by telephone before reaching the recipient by messenger, to the use of aircraft in wartime.

Items shown included the labels, markings, stamps and forms that were used, many proving scarce, especially the forms as these were usually destroyed. One striking item was a letter sent 'Express' from Balmoral Castle to Windsor Castle, hand written by Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

Alex Haimann FRPSL gave the Vote of Thanks to Julian, remarking that all had learned something new during the presentation, at the same time seeing items that told many a human story.

FERNDOWN AND WEST MOORS SOCIETY. MEETING 22ND JANUARY. MIND YOUR P'S AND Q'S. BY BARRY HOBBS...

The title of the display created some puzzlement among the assembled members and it came as something of a surprise when Barry explained that the letters stood for Pills, Potions and Quackery – a history of Quack Medicine in the USA as told through illustrated covers sent during the golden age of such advertising from the 1850s up to the end of the First World War.

Until the passing of the food and Drug Act in 1906, there was no restriction whatsoever on whom could set up as a drug manufacturer. Some people were genuine and wanted to improve the lot of their fellow men and women. However, many were often charlatans whose only interest was in making vast amounts of money. The claims made for the preparations were often inflated and dishonest and Barry illustrated this point by referring to medicines claiming permanent cures for cancer, consumption and Spanish flu. The contents of these medications could be nothing more than placebos. At the other end of the spectrum some were positively dangerous and addictive. They could do serious harm and in extreme cases prove fatal if taken in sufficient quantities. A common ingredient in many potions was alcohol – considerable quantities of it - that ensured that if nothing else, the patient felt some relief from the symptoms of the disease!

In the first half of the evening, Barry talked of the symbiotic relationship that existed between the medicine industry and the American Post Office, as many manufacturers conducted much of their business by mail order. A symbiotic relationship also existed between the medicine companies and the newspaper industry. Heavy advertising was essential for success and newspapers depended on the revenues generated for their survival. This mutual dependence did much to prevent editors and reporters from campaigning for laws to regulate medicines.

In the second half, Barry displayed covers advertising bandages, supports and artificial limbs. Veterinary medicines also featured as people often used them for human complaints – two spoonful's for the horse and one for the human! Barry rounded off the evening by placing the illustrated envelopes in the wider context of advertising in general, displaying trade cards, revenue and encased stamps, testimonial booklets and songsters used in medicine shows.
